About Nigeria

Nigeria is a country that has the highest population in the African continent. This is proved by the 21st to 25th March 2006 population census.

Nigeria's population was estimated to be about 190.9 million (2017) and As of **2019**, the estimated **population** of the country is over 200.96 million, ranking 7th in the world. The Current Nigeria Population as of 2021 ending is about 206.1 million.

Nigeria, which is officially known as The Federal Republic of Nigeria, stands as a border, the Benin Republic on the west, Cameroon on the east, the Gulf of Guinea on the south, and Niger to the north.

Currently, Nigeria is made up of 36 STATES and the Federal Capital Territory (FCT). With 109 Senatorial Districts, 360 Federal Constituencies, 990 State Constituencies, 774 Local Governments, 8810 wards.

Former Colonial Masters

ABOUT FREDERICK LORD LUGARD

Frederick John Dealtry Lugard, 1st Baron Lugard (1858-1945), was a British imperialist and colonial administrator in Africa. He made significant contributions to the theory and practice of the British colonial policy of indirect rule.

In 1906 Lugard resigned as high commissioner and the following year accepted an appointment as governor of Hong Kong, where he remained until 1911.

Then, in 1912, he returned to Nigeria as governor of both the Northern and Southern protectorates, charged with amalgamating the two territories into a single unit.

On January 1, 1914, Lord Frederick Lugard, the governor of both the Northern Nigeria Protectorate and the Colony and Protectorate of Southern Nigeria, signed a document consolidating the two, thereby creating the Colony and Protectorate of Nigeria.

Forty-six years later in 1960, Nigeria became an independent state. Anniversaries are times for reflection, and given that today, just over 104 years after amalgamation, the country is still grappling with its national identity and a reanimated separatist movement, it is worth reflecting on how exactly Nigeria became Nigeria.

Former Vice president Atiku Abubakar clinched the presidential ticket of the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP), having scored the highest vote in the party's primary election held on May 28 at the Moshood Abiola National Stadium in Abuja.

3. Bola Ahmed Tinubu (APC)

Former governor of Lagos State, Bola Ahmed Tinubu, emerged the flagbearer of the All Progressives Congress (APC) for the 2023 election in the primary election held on Wednesday, June 8, 2022, in Abuja.

4. Christopher Irene Imumolen (AP)

A professor, Christopher Imumolen, clinched the presidential ticket of the Accord Party for the general election in 2023. Imumolen is the founder of Joint Professional Training and Support International Limited and UNIC Foundation, a non-profit, non-governmental organization.

5. Dumebi Kachikwu (ADC)

Founder and Chief Executive Officer of Roots TV Nigeria, Dumebi Kachikwu, emerged as the presidential candidate of the African Democratic Congress (ADC) at the party's presidential primary election, which was held in Abeokuta on June 9.

6. Hamza Al-Mustapha (AA)

The Chief Security Officer to late Sani Abacha, Hamza Al-Mustapha (rtd), emerged as the presidential candidate of the Action Alliance for the 2023 general elections.

Nigeria ASUU Strike History (Updated)

1. **1988:** First ASUU Strike ever, to obtain fair wages and university autonomy.
2. **1992:** Second ASUU strike in history.
3. **1994:** Protest against the dismissal of staff by the Sani Abacha military regime.
4. **1996:** Protest against the dismissal of staff by the Sani Abacha military regime.
5. **1999:** After Obasanjo was sworn-in as president and it lasted for **five months**.
6. **2001:** over the reinstatement of 49 lecturers sacked at Unilorin. This strike lasted for **three months**
7. **2002:** Obasanjo's administration failed to implement the agreement. The strike lasted for **two weeks**.
8. **2003:** Due to non-implementation of previous agreements. Lasted for 6 months.
9. **2005:** The lecturers went on strike for just **two weeks**.
10. **2006:** Another **one week** strike because the Federal Government refused to implement the agreement.
11. **2007:** Three **months** strike because the federal government remains unfaithful.
12. **2008:** One **week** strike, improved salary scheme and reinstatement of 49 lecturers were reasons for the strike.
13. **2009:** Four **months** strike which led to another agreement with Federal Government
14. **2010:** Another big strike which lasted for **five months** all because FG was caching cruise with ASUU
15. **2011:** 59 **days** strike as the federal government refuses to honor the 2009 agreement. It ended in 2012.
16. **2013:** Federal Government failed to honour the agreement with ASUU leading to **5 Months** strike.
17. **2017:** Another strike due to unresolved issues with the FG.
18. **2018:** Two months of ASUU strike which started in November 2018 **ended in 2019**.
19. **2019:** The 2018 ASUU strike ended in 2019.
20. **2020:** The strike began on March 9th
21. **2022:** February 14th, 2022 to October 17th, 2022 (8th Months Strike).
22. **2023:** ASUU Planned to strike on August (Didn't happen)
